Speaker and Competition Judge: Sandy Dimke

Presentation Topic: The Importance of Printing

As former chair of the Pictorial Print Division for the Photographic Society of America (and still on their Board of Directors), prints are a huge part of Sandy's life. She knows firsthand the importance of printing as well as the lack of popularity for prints in the 21st century. In this presentation, the joys and importance of seeing your images in print will be discussed. Printing your own vs sending them to a commercial printer. Topics include: Different types of papers as well as archival papers and various manufacturers. Exhibiting prints as well as membership in Photographic Society of America and their print related study groups and exhibitions will be mentioned. Keep an open mind and come and enjoy this integral aspect of photography.

After spending over thirty years in architectural photography in Connecticut, Sandy now lives just north of the Broad, in Bull Point, with her husband Russ, where she concentrates on fine art photography.

Her goal is to freeze moments in a creative way, either by unique camera angles or adding a different perspective with post processing. A traveler at heart, her photos try to capture the excitement of the world around her, whether in coastal South Carolina, or in more exotic locales around the globe.

Sandy's books include Hands Across the Lowcountry and The Cats of Beaufort.

Her photo "Winter Façade" was chosen as the cover for Charleston Salt and Iron and "Southern Backseat Drivers" was selected for the cover of Along Southern Roads.

Her images have been juried into over thirty (in-person) exhibits including Artfields, Biennale at Art League of Hilton Head, Piccolo Spoleto, Grand Visions at the Grand Central Library in New York City, and Gallery 26 in Charleston. Two have her photographs are appearing in a juried exhibit in Monmouth Museum in NJ. Several years ago, Sandy received Best in Show for "Solitary Pine" at the CNPA Annual Convention. Digitally her photographic images have been accepted into over 100 international exhibitions in more than 25 countries around the world and have won numerous awards.

Sandy just retired as the worldwide Chair of the Pictorial Print Division of Photographic Society of America and remains on their Board. She is an accredited PSA judge and has critiqued images for over 40 years across the US. She was inducted into the Federation Internationale d'Art Photographique in 2022 where she holds their AFIAP distinction.

In 2019 she was juried into the National Association of Women Artists and won their Annual Photography award in 2021. She is a certified peer juror for NAWA also.

Her work is exhibited at the Brick Wall Gallery of Beaufort Art Association where she recently had a solo exhibit called "Frozen Moments" – a retrospective of her 50 years in Photography. Sandy is on the Beaufort Art Association Board as VP Gallery.

Feature Article

Tom Mills Style Turns Classes and SIGs into Real Learning Moments

If you've ever walked out of a Photography Club class or SIG, newly energized to shoot and to talk about pictures, you've likely felt Tom Mills' influence. "I love to teach," he says. "There's nothing more exhilarating than having one go well," where he comes home and tells his wife Kay (also a club member), "I nailed that." A lifelong photographer raised around cameras and darkrooms — his father was a journalist and photographer — Tom joined the club soon after moving to Sun City about 13 years ago and quickly

helped reshape how we learn here.

Years ago, Tom chaired the Photography Club's Curriculum Committee alongside Freddi Hoffman, John Burrack, Corky Burt, and Tom Ryne. Together, they set out to rethink what the club taught and how it was taught. They quickly noticed a gap. "The club was very much oriented toward the technical... F-stops and ISOs. We could spend a little more time on the aesthetics — the art of photography." He explained that observation helped spark our Fundamentals of Photography classes: small, hands-on sessions with brand-savvy advisors (Canon, Nikon, Sony, Lumix), real-time shooting outside the studio, and immediate group critiques back on the screen. "People loved it," he says. "You brought your new camera, we showed you how to take pictures with it."

It was a natural role for him. Tom comes from a family of teachers and spent his career teaching physiology and urology at the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University, and he still prepares for photo classes with the same deliberate care. From that success grew two long-running SIGs he's led over about the past five years. The Composition SIG (Comp SIG) gave newcomers a "safer place" to practice critique, prepare competition entries, and learn how to put their work out there. "Art is risk going public," says Tom. The Black & White SIG leaned into photography as fine art, studying iconic photographers such as Henri Cartier-Bresson, widely regarded as the father of modern photojournalism, and building a shared visual vocabulary. "We spent more time on the art of photography," Tom says. Attendance surged — "we were running out of space" — and members grew with it. "They got way better."

Critique is now embedded across much of our education program. "Almost all the classes have a critique part. You learn something, you go shoot, you come back and show pictures based on what you learned." As for what's next, Tom is eyeing today's realities. "Cell phones are the future... so well engineered you can't take a bad picture. That means your job is where you aim the camera." He's considering rebooting a foundational, novice-friendly critique SIG built around phone photography — less tech, more picture-making: story, subject, balance, mood, and camera angle.

Why should more members teach? "In order to teach something, you've got to know about it — you end up being kind of an expert," Tom says. And the payoff is personal, too. "I get a kick out of it... I over-prepare, I'm always a little nervous, but it's worth it." As Kay adds, "He practices," a habit stretching back to his medical-school teaching days.

Leadership transitions are underway for the two SIGs Tom has nurtured over the past five years, as he shifts his energy toward new ways to support learning in the club. Longtime member Dale Methven is set to guide Composition, and the club is looking forward to a member stepping up for Black & White. As those groups move forward, Tom's north star remains unchanged: less fear, more seeing, and honest, constructive conversation. His influence endures as part of a larger effort — one shaped by many voices, all committed to helping members grow. "Critiquing is something you learn to do — using positive terms. Nobody's out to fry you." That spirit — "friends helping friends" makes stronger photographs — is the real legacy of Tom's SIGs and classes.

Please include which Tuesday, your name, e-mail address and phone contact information to be assigned your arrival time between 1pm and 3:30pm on the date you want.

Studio Fees: On or about December 1st, our studio fees will be going up by 50%. That seems like a big increase, but the actual monetary amounts are modest and still keep us well under outside rates.

Club Orientation: Orientation sessions are scheduled from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm on November 24th and December 29th. These sessions are geared towards new (or newer) Photography Club members and will introduce you to the studio and the many facets of our club. Sessions are usually led by the club's President, with introductions provided by the club's officers and leadership team.

It's hard to believe that our Fall Semester is quickly coming to a close. And what a busy semester it was for administration purposes.

This semester we had a higher than normal volume of "no shows" and "walk-ins." Just because you marked a class on your calendar does not mean that you registered for it. PLEASE check this link for the Fall Student List of Classes, updated

nightly. It includes all registered individuals—sorted by last name—along with their current list of classes and registration status (Registered, Waitlisted, Cancelled, Walk In, No Show, etc.). Also please do not assume that seats are available just because you see a class on the club's calendar. If a class is full, walk-ins will be turned away. Additionally, walk-ins create a delay in the start of a class because the monitor must take down the individual's information. Therefore, if you are interested in taking a class, you must register first.

Upon registration, you will receive a confirmation email noting the classes that you have successfully registered for as well as any class that you have been waitlisted for. Also, the email includes the link for the Student List of classes mentioned above as well as details about what to do in case you need to cancel.

"Cancellations must be made 24 hours before class to avoid your CAM being charged. Email Ward Litzenberg at pcschheducation@gmail.com to cancel."

It is important that Ward receive the cancellation as soon as possible so that he can alert those who are waitlisted that a seat has become available. To avoid cancellations, we ask that you double-check your availability for all sessions. If you cannot attend all sessions, please do not register for that class.

We photographed Looking Glass Falls in Brevard NC, Elk at the Oconaluftee Visitors Center in Cherokie NC, the waterfalls in Bryson City TN, sunset & the milky way from Waterrock Knob NC and that was just in the first two days of the trip. On day three, we stopped at Newfound Gap TN for the sunrise then headed to the Cades Cove Loop in Townsend TN. On day four, we wrapped up the trip in Gatlinburg driving through the Roaring Forks Nature Trail before heading home on day five.

About Field Trips

If you are new to the Photography Club or haven't been on a field trip in a while, there are many benefits of going on Field Trips, which include but are not limited to:

- All Skill Levels and Cameras: If you are new to photography or a seasoned photographer, Field trips are open to everyone in the Photography Club.
- Make Friends: Meet and get to know other members of the Photography Club
- Cameras: All cameras are suitable for our field trips, including your cell phones.
- Learning: By going out and photographing a variety of subjects under different conditions, you develop the photographic muscle memory you need to improve your skills. The more you shoot the better you get.
